
PUNCTUATION





Full Stop

This shows the end of a sentence. A sentence always contains a noun and a verb and always makes sense on its own..

Example

On Saturday I'm going shopping.



Exclamation Mark

This ends a sentence to show excitement, surprise, anger or emphasis.

Example

- I passed my exams!
- I forgot my phone!



Semicolon

We can use this instead of a full stop to join two sentences that are related.

Example

My sister bought some chocolate; I love chocolate.



Colon

We use this at the start of a list.

Example

On holiday I went to these places the museum, the beach, the mall and some restaurants.



Question Mark

This ends a sentence that is a question.

Example

How old are you?



Apostrophe

We use an apostrophe 'when we make words shorter.

Example
Do not = don't

We will = we 'll

We also use them to show ownership (possession). If the owner is 1 person add s.

Example

This is Sarah's house.
(The house belongs to Sarah)

If the owner's name ends in s, just add '. James' phone is broken.

If there is more than 1 owner (plural) add 1s. I like children's books.

The dogs food is here. (More than 1 dog)



Comma

This can be used to separate items in a list.

Example

This morning I ate a banana, an apple, chocolate and some nuts.

It can also be used to separate a phrase that could be left out of a sentence and would still make sense.

Example

Sarah, my best friend, is a teacher.

In longer sentences we can use a comma to join two parts.

I like going on holiday to hot countries, but I don't like long
